On Wednesday, Ms. Roberts will judge EXC/Master Std followed by T2B in Ring 1 running high to low (26-4). Ms. Everline will judge EXC/Master JWW followed by Fast all levels in Ring 2 running high to low beginning with 16 Inch dogs (16, 12, 8, 4, 26, 24, 20)

MEASUREMENT REQUIREMENTS

All dogs must have a valid Agility Height Card issued by AKC or be measured prior to any runs (except dogs jumping at the 24" height) at a trial or group of trials. Ms. Karen Wlodarski has graciously agreed to serve as a VMO, in addition to one of our judges, Mrs. Diane Fyfe. Any entered dog needing an official measurement is required to be measured. It is suggested that you come early morning while courses are being set to be measured. Being measured prior to your run is the responsibility of the exhibitors.

VOLUNTEERS

We sincerely thank all of you who are willing to volunteer to help at these trials. Without a large number of workers these trials would not be possible. On-line sign up for workers is now available. This should simplify the process and offer the flexibility of making changes if your plans should change. Sign-up sheets will also be posted at the trial for last minute changes. Only those registered as "Unloaders" may enter at 9:00 AM on Wednesday to set up and then unload the equipment and build courses for the trial. All other exhibitors may enter on Wednesday at 10:30 AM to unload and set up.

DIRECTIONS TO SITE

From Atlanta (or North): Take I-75 South to the Macon By-Pass (I-475). Take the Macon By-Pass. It will put you back on I-75 South. Take Exit #135. Go left to the Agricenter. Enter at the East Gate.

From South: Take I-75 North to Exit #135. Go right and proceed as above.

PARKING NOTICE

Enter the Agricenter through the East Gate. Please follow directions to designated parking for Agility. Do not park in areas other than the designated areas. **Parking at the rear and inside of Reaves Arena is limited to loading & unloading and trial officials (by permit) only. You will be notified and receive a parking pass if you are designated to park in these areas.**

ACCESS TO BUILDING ON WEDNESDAY, JULY 12

Reaves Arena will be open for exhibitors to set up beginning at 10:30 AM on Wednesday, July 12. Only committee members and designated "Unloaders" (you must be signed up) are permitted to enter at 9:00 AM.

Refer to the Perry CVB website, www.perryga.com for additional hotels. Exhibitors are reminded to be responsible dog owners at the hotel sites as well as on the show grounds. Exhibitors are required to observe each hotel or motel's regulations regarding pets. There are a number of dog events using these facilities and it is imperative that exhibitors do their part in helping to keep hotels open to pets. Violators may be subject to an Event Committee hearing.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

We may water the arena floor and/or spray for insects any evening after the trial. Exhibitors are cautioned to take action to prevent damage or contamination to personal property left in the building. All dogs must be removed from the building within ½ hour after the last run. Exhibitors are responsible for their personal property at all times.

DOGS ON LEASH

AKC Regulations state 'Dogs shall be on leash at all times when on the show grounds except in the ring and at the warm-up jump area.' We must strictly enforce this regulation as it is also an Agricenter rule.

GNFA MECHANICAL EQUIPMENT POLICY

Skateboards, scooters, roller skates, hover boards, roller blades, and other similar mechanical equipment are prohibited within all property known as the Georgia National Fairgrounds & Agricenter. This policy will be strictly enforced.

CANINE INFLUENZA PROCEDURES FOR PERRY AGILITY TRIALS

We know that many of you are concerned about the recent canine influenza outbreak. While the virus is contagious, everything we have received from various sources indicates that it is passed dog to dog through direct contact with oral or nasal secretions. Therefore, we are taking some precautions that will reduce the likelihood of contact at our upcoming trials in Perry. The first and most important thing is that dog owners comply with AKC published guidelines and not bring dogs to the trials that have contracted the disease or been exposed to dogs with the disease in the last 30 days. In this regard, we are relying on owners to be responsible just as we do that they not bring dogs with parvo, distemper or other contagious diseases to events with other dogs. To limit the financial hardship on

responsible owners, we will refund the full entry fees, less the AKC fees, for any dog diagnosed by a veterinarian to have canine influenza, even past the closing date until the beginning of the trials. Any dog at the trial, observed with suspicious respiratory symptoms (e.g., coughing, sneezing, nasal secretions) will be asked to leave by the Trial Committee unless the owner has a veterinarian diagnosis that the observed symptoms are not related to canine influenza.

The most prevalent transmission of the virus is by direct nose to nose contact with infected dogs or their nasal secretions. Exhibitors need to be aware of their dogs at all times, especially in the arena floor area, and avoid contact with other dogs. We will ask exhibitors to bring their dogs to the arena floor no more than 10 minutes prior to their estimated run time. We also ask that exhibitors return their dogs to their crating area immediately after their run. We apologize that this may have a negative effect on well-deserved celebrations after a great run. We will have only one dog at a time in the entry chutes. Also, we will dip the leash grabber in a disinfectant solution between each run. Any treats brought to the arena floor must be in a sealed zip lock bag (the clubs will have a supply available). All treats must be removed immediately after your run. Treats not reclaimed in a timely manner will be disposed of by the trial committee.

Although the virus is not a clinically airborne virus, the virus can be projected up to 20 feet by sneezing or coughing. It is suggested that exhibitors bring some sort of covering for their crates to reduce the risk of contamination from a passing dog.

As always, dogs are not allowed off leash on the GNFA property except when competing in the ring. We ask all exhibitors to cooperate with these precautions to minimize the risk to all the dogs. We apologize for any inconveniences these procedures might bring and we thank for in advance for your cooperation. We look forward to a future trial when all these precautions will not be necessary.
