ACT 1 is an entry level test that is open to all dogs that have not earned a title in any AKC Agility class. Dogs must have two passing ACT 1 scores in order to earn the ACT 1 title. Both passing scores may be obtained under the same judge/evaluator. To receive the title certificate and have the title added to a dog's record, the dog must be registered/listed with the AKC.

ACT 2 is the second level Agility Course Test that is open to all dogs that have not earned a title in any AKC Agility class except an ACT 1 title. Dogs must have two passing ACT 2 scores in order to earn the ACT 2 title. Both passing scores may be obtained under the same judge/evaluator. To receive the title certificate and have the title added to a dog's record, the dog must be registered/listed with the AKC. The ACT 2 title will supersede the ACT 1 title on a dog's record.

SOME ACT NOTES:

If you title in ACT 1 and have NO ACT 2 legs (and no Novice AKC title) you can continue running in ACT 1.

If you have ACT 2 legs....

...and you title in ACT 1 Round 1, you can still run ACT 1 Round 2 same day or you can move up to ACT 2 if you are not already entered in ACT 2. No refunds will be given.

If you have ACT 2 legs....

Once you title in ACT 2 you are no longer eligible to run in ACT 1. After your ACT 2 title you can continue running in ACT 2 until you have a Novice AKC title.

REFUNDS:

Refund requests received prior to the close of entries will be charged a \$5.00 per day processing fee. After the close of entries, refunds minus a \$10.00 per day processing fee may be allowed on a case-by-case basis (bitch in season or an injury to your dog would be valid reasons to request a refund) if a request is made via email to TrialSec@PerryAgility.com by 7am on the day of the trial. No refunds after 7am on the day of the trial.

HEIGHT DIVISIONS:

For the ACT Program dogs may participate at any jump height which is determined by the owner. There is no Regular/Preferred split for ACTs.

However, here are the AKC regulation jump heights for a sanctioned agility trial.

Regular	Preferred	
8 Inches	4 Inches	For dogs 11" and under at the withers
12 Inches	8 Inches	For dogs 14" and under at the withers
16 Inches	12 Inches	For dogs 18" and under at the withers
20 Inches	16 Inches	For dogs 22" and under at the withers
24 inches	20 Inches	For dogs over 22" at the withers

AWARDS:

A dark green qualifying ribbon will be available to all qualifying dogs.

A title ribbon will be available to all dogs achieving a new title.

All ribbons must be claimed the day of the trial. None will be mailed.

COURSE FAMILIARIZATION:

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, will be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training the dog.

RINGSIDE:

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging. Crating is limited, first priority is for volunteers. Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required. No refunds will be issued for absent or late dogs.

OBSTACLES & TIMING:

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. This trial will be held indoors on mats with ring dimensions of approx. 43'x 84'. Timing will be done with a stopwatch or electronic judging system.

ACT 1 is 10-12 obstacles and consists of the a-frame, pause table, open tunnel(s), bar jumps, and MAY also use the panel jump, and/or tire jump.

ACT 2 is 11-13 obstacles and consists of the a-frame, teeter, pause table, weave poles (6), open tunnel(s), tire jump, bar jumps, and MAY use the dog walk, double bar jump, panel jump, broad jump, and/or triple bar jump. There will be no dog walk at these trials.

ELIGIBILITY OF DOGS:

All dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older may enter a test. Dogs must be physically sound as described in Chapter 1, Section 3, Paragraph 7 of the Regulations for Agility Trials. Dogs that are blind or deaf shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dogs shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes.

In order to acquire the title certificate and have the title added to a dog's record, the dog must be registered/listed with the AKC. Canine Partner applications may be accepted at the test by the judge/evaluator and submitted with test results. Dogs that are not AKC registered/listed may participate and their performance will be recorded by the AKC under a temporary recording number. This temporary recording number will be e-mailed to the owner and must be used when entering subsequent ACT events and when the owner registers/lists the dog.

Go north on GA 400 to Exit 12B

Go south on GA 400 to Exit 12

Turn right onto McFarland Pkwy and go 1.5 miles to Alpha Dr on the right

PARKING:

Exhibitors are governed by any rules or regulations of civic authorized and building and parking regulations. Vehicles parked contrary to regulations will be subject to towing at owner's expense.

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION:

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs, themselves, and/or their children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.

I (we) acknowledge that if this application for the entry of this dog is made available to me (us) for participation in this event, that I (we) agree that this facility/club has the right to refuse the entry of this dog and/or they reserve the right to dismiss the dog and myself for cause which the facility/club deems to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this and the opportunity to train my dog(s), I (we) agree to hold American Kennel Club, Atlanta Kennel Club, the facility and all associates harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog or dogs while in or upon the premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for damage or injury to the dog or myself, either physically or mentally, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury, be caused or alleged to be caused by negligence while in or upon the premises of the trial grounds.

All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.

All regulations governing the use of this facility, and all regulations and decisions of the trial committee at this trial will be strictly enforced, including and not limited to the recorded information of this premium list.

AGREEMENT

I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents, event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge or ACT Evaluator, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog. Additionally, I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify, defend and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damage because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this event, however such, injuries, death or property damage may be caused, and whether or not the same may have been caused or may be alleged to have been caused by the negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees, agents, or any other person. INSTRUCTIONS

Dogs may be entered in any jump height. There is no Regular or Preferred distinction at AKC's ACT events.

In order to acquire the ACT1 or ACT2 title certificate and have the title added to a dog's record, the dog must be registered/listed with the American Kennel Club. **AKC Canine PartnersSM** applications may be accepted at the event and submitted to AKC with the event's results.

Dogs that are not AKC registered/listed may be registered at a later date and receive their ACT title at that time.

Dogs listed in the **AKC Canine PartnersSM** program should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler Number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner?
